As there is no meeting for the next 3 weeks there will be Bulletins 21st September and 5th October but no Bulletin for the 28th September.

THIS WEEK 14th September Meal & Speaker Sarah Wiley - Richmond WA - provider of mental health and wellbeing services

Chair Ralf opened the meeting and told us that he had just returned from Germany where he experienced 'tropical temperatures' of 40°C. and the Danube was mud and not trafficable by ferries. He mentioned that there is to be another Pretzel night.

President Ian welcomed members and our speaker Sarah Wiley.

Speaker:- John Dodman introduced Sarah Wiley, who was formerly known to us through our connections with MND Assoc of WA where she worked for 8 years. Sarah said she is now the General Manager, Partnerships and Impact for Richmond WA, a service provider of mental health and wellbeing services for the last 52 years and is the largest provider in

the area. They supply support services and some residential places, reaching from Karratha to Albany.



Richmind have started a new project - Yellow benches which had their beginnings in Zimbabwe where they are called friendship or blue benches. Richmind aim for the yellow benches to be used by people to start conversations with strangers as people currently are liable to fall through the cracks. Although they are not professional psychologists, they help people with eating disorders and have residential facilities and for some activities they are funded by the mental health commission but not for the benches. They are hoping to get help from Men's Sheds and also from Bunnings.

New Norcia Visit

Ralf said that the visit to New Norcia was very successful and enjoyed by all who attended. The food supplied by the monks was adequate but basic and the wine they make was variable with the white being acceptable, but nobody liked the red. They also make their own olive oil and beer which was generally not appreciated (one description was horrible). The visitors were also able to have BYO at mealtimes. The life of the monks begins at 4.30AM every morning and ends at 8 PM when they go to bed. There are 5 active monks, and they employ about 30 people to run various activities such as farming winemaking and baking. The monastery (founded in 1847 by Father Salvado) has several chapels, 24 buildings, a farm and it used to run 2 boarding schools – one for paying white students and the other free for indigenous students.

The monks have mass every day and the one the club attended was very interesting. They have an organ which is German and cost \$1000 when it was purchased 100 years ago. They knocked down a back wall to get it in. The monks pray 6 times a day and don't talk very much. Our group had a 2-hour talk and a 2-hour walking tour. ([photos below](#))

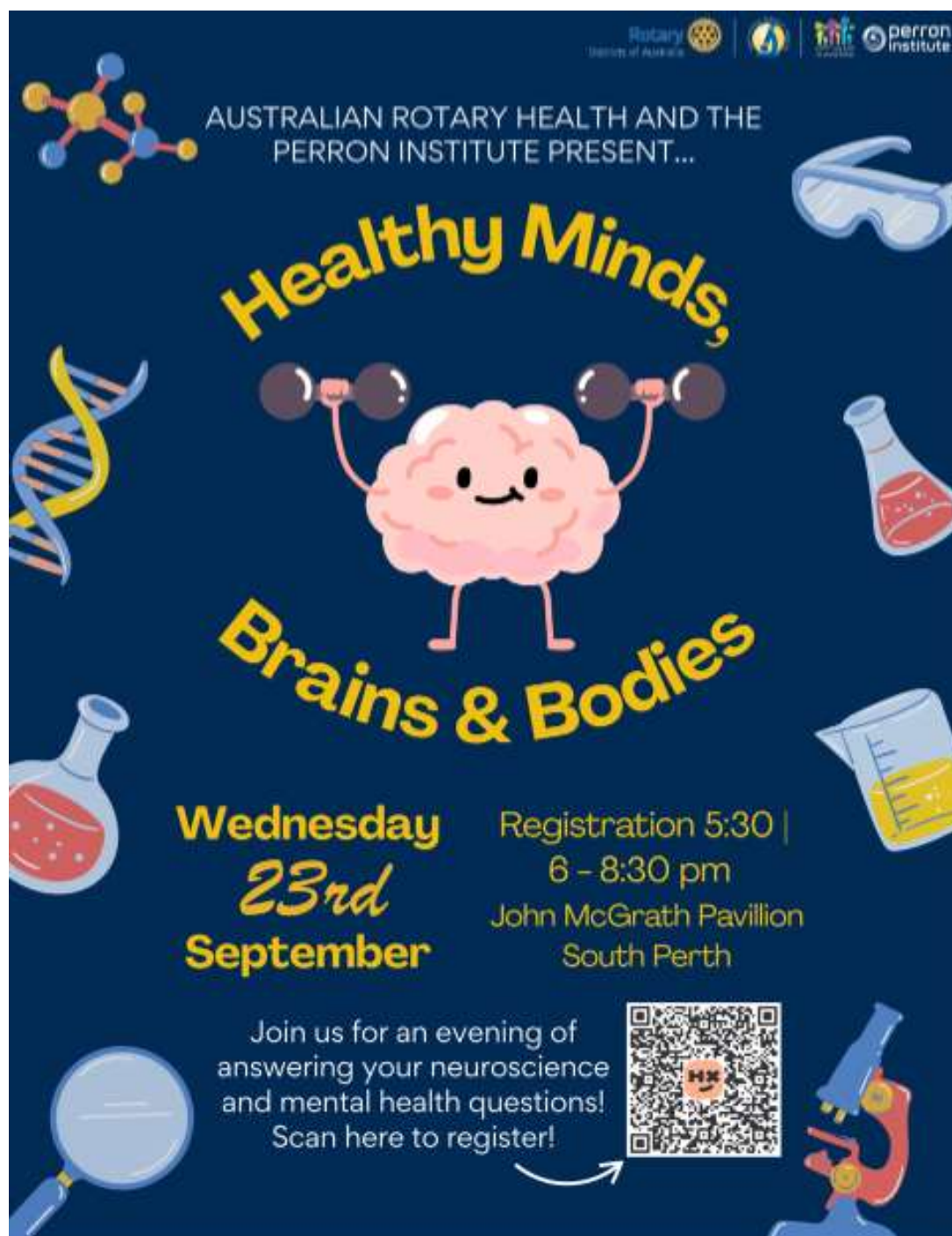

From Kim Shelterbox Urgent Appeal - Nepal Disaster

Our Nepal response is now underway. If you have already donated, thank you on behalf of those affected. Here's the latest from the team on the ground.

- A ShelterBox team is in Kathmandu. We are working with several partners on a response plan.
- On Tuesday (8th of September), we distributed tarpaulins and other household items (sleeping mats, rope, pillows) in Nuwakot to 460 families with our partners, Islamic Relief and Rotary (procured locally for quick distribution).
- A further distribution took place on Wednesday to another 111 families (around 1,000 households in total)
- A flight of aid also arrived in Kathmandu on Tuesday with family tents, tarpaulins, ropes and solar lights – part of our response with partner People In Need (PIN) to import aid into Nepal. Helicopters will take these items to warehouses near remote villages and other hard-to-reach areas next week.
- Nearly two weeks after the 26 August floods, operations are shifting from search and rescue to relief and recovery, though rescues continue.
- Damaged roads and collapsed bridges continue to isolate upstream communities and severely restrict relief access. In several areas, helicopters remain the only way to reach affected people with life-saving assistance.
